

Tank irrigation is practised mainly in peninsular India due to the following reasons

- 1. The undulating relief and hard rocks make it difficult to dig canals and wells.
- 2. There is little percolation of rainwater due to the hard rock structure and groundwater is not available in large quantity.
- 3. Most of the rivers of this region are seasonal and dry up in the summer season. Therefore, they cannot supply water to canals throughout the year.
- 4. The scattered nature of population and agricultural fields also favours tank irrigation.

It is in this area that the cold Labrador Current mixes with the warm waters of the Gulf Stream. The mixing of these waters and the shape of the ocean bottom lifts nutrients to the surface.

These conditions created one of the richest fishing grounds in the world. Plankton is organisms that live in the water. They are carried by waves, tides and currents. They are usually found in shallow surface waters.

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
