

Inclusive growth is typically fuelled by market-driven sources of growth with the government playing a facilitating role. Inclusive growth focuses on both the pace and pattern of growth.

How growth is generated is critical for accelerating poverty reduction, hence it focuses on productive employment rather than income redistribution.

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Q4. Answer: (c)

Employment Elasticity (of growth) is a measure of percentage change in employment associated with 1 percentage change in economic growth.

Employment elasticity = % change in employment/ % change in economic growth

Employment elasticity of 0.01 implies that with every 1 percentage point growth in GDP, employment increases by just .01 per cent. Employment elasticity is falling consistently from 0.4 in the 1990s to 0.2 in 2014 and then 0.1 now.

The agriculture sector is highly labour-intensive employing around 47% of the labour force to produce 16% of GDP. So, the employment elasticity of the agriculture sector is more.

According to the trickle-down hypothesis, the rapid growth of per capita income will be associated with a reduction in poverty.

In India, this hypothesis has been interpreted to suggest that growth in agriculture output without radical institution reform will reduce the incidence of poverty in the context of agricultural development in India.
