Meaning: Sardonic - Humorous or disrespectful, Scripture - the sacred writings of a religion, Ideologue - an advocate of an ideology, Fugitive - someone who flees from law

Being fired from the restaurant, the action made by a person can be of two types, either apologetic or audacious. With no word in the options conveying the meaning similar to "apology", we assume, the action definitely shows audacity. Also, being an adjective to be placed before review, we need an adjective to be filled in blank.

Thus, "**Scripture and Ideologue**" don't fit here. "Narrow" can't be an adjective to a review and "Fugitive" is a noun that refers to an identity of a person. Therefore, "**Sardonic**" which means "disrespectful" can be used as adjective to review.

“Politely and willingly” are adverbs. Here the word needed before “Pakistani” is an adjective. Border firings can't be named as Declared, Undeclared or Inactive. “Unprovoked” is the

correct answer.
