**Q1. Answer: (d)**

5 ? flowers/not/bad 9 ? good

Hence, code for 59 cannot be determined as data is inadequate.

**Q2. Answer: (a)**

According to the questions, code for 'good' ? 9.

**Q3. Answer: (b)**

According to the questions, code for 'not' ? 8 or 5 or 2.

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**Q4. Answer: (c)**

are ? 6, you ? 1, where ? 4

hence, are you where ? 614.

**Q5. Answer: (d)**

Data inadequate to answer the question.

As the code for 'flowers' and 'not' cannot be determined.

**Q6. Answer: (b)**

how can **you** go ? ja da **ka** pa .....(i)

**you** come here ? na **ka** sa .....(ii)

come and go ? ra pa sa .....(iii)

From Eqs. (i) and (ii), you = ka From Eqs. (ii) and (iii),

come = sa hence, here ? na.

**Q7. Answer: (d)**

Sue **Re** *Nik* ? *She is* brave .....(i)

Pi Sor **Re** *Nik* ? *She is* always smiling .....(ii)

Sor **Re** *Zhi* ? *is* always cheerful .....(iii)

From Eqs. (i), (ii) and (iii), code for smiling is Pi.

**Q8. Answer: (c)**

**pick and** choose ? **ko** ho **po** .....(i)

**pick up and** come ? to no **ko po** .....(ii)

From Eqs. (i) and (ii). Pick and ? ko po pick ? ko or po.

**Q9. Answer: (c)**

no **more** food ? ta **ka** da .....(i)

**more** than that ? sa pa **ka** .....(ii)

From Eqs. (i) and (ii), more ? ka.

That ? 'sa' or 'pa'.

**Q10. Answer: (c)**

Monday is **a holiday** ? sa **da** pa **na** .....(i)

they enjoy **a holiday** ? **da** na ta ka .....(ii)

From Eqs. (i) and (ii), a holiday ? da na Monday ? 'sa' or 'pa'.

**Q11. Answer: (c)**

In the first and second statements, the common code-word is 'dogs'.

So, 'kun' means 'dogs'.

In the first and third statements, the common code-word is 'tom' and the common word is 'are'.

So, 'tom' means 'are'.

Thus, in the first statement, 'sud' means 'barking'.

**Q12. Answer: (b)**

In the first and second statements, the common code-word is 'mot' and the common word is 'is'.

So, 'mot' means 'is'.

In the second and third statements, the common code-word is 'baj' and the common word is 'dancing'.

So, 'baj' means 'dancing'.

Thus in the second statement, 'min' means 'good'.



**Q13. Answer: (d)**

We can find the code for 'food' from the first and second statements.

Now, to find the code for 'hot', we need the code for 'bring' which cannot be determined from the given information.

**Q14. Answer: (a)**

In the first and second statements, the common code-words are 'cinto' and 'tsi' and the common words are 'her' and 'is'.

So, 'cinto' and 'tsi' are the codes for 'her' and 'is'.

In the second and third statements, the common code-words are 'cinto', 'tsi' and 'oind' and the common words are 'her', 'is' and 'literature'.

Now, 'cinto' and 'tsi' are codes for 'her' and 'is'.

So, 'oind' stands for 'literature'.

**Q15. Answer: (d)**

In the first and second statements, the common code-word is 'nat' and the common word is 'harmful'.

So, 'nat' means 'harmful'.

In the second and third statements, the common code-word is 'dor' and the common word is 'avoid'.

So, 'dor' means 'avoid'.

Thus, in the second statement, 'vog' means 'habit'.

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
